## **GENERAL BROCK PARK RENEWAL**



Ball hockey court Underutilized fenced area with uneven concrete surfacing with aged features and faded lines on the court



Grass field



Park edge at laneway Cars parked between the trees damaging the trees, grass and impacting the path experience



Rolling grassy hills The rolling grassy hills by the sidewalk is the highest area of the park with a clear view of the entire park and playground







Sidewalk on Brock St Sidewalk, row of trees and parked cars along the southern park boundary on a residential street

Laneway entrance The park entrance off Gladstone St and E29th Ave has no designated path along an active laneway



Low points along the edge of the field for drainage creates a trip hazard for users of the sports field



Walking path Mature trees along the popular path buffer from the laneway creates a defined park boundary

The edge of the field is sloped and facing the large grass field

Park entrance The entrance closest to Nanaimo St is close to vehicles entering the laneway with a small sign that is hard to read



Playground area The southwest corner of the park leads to the play area with slides, swings and other play features for younger kids
