


## What's Happening?

The Vancouver Park Board is seeking your input on a proposed dog off-leash area in Granville Park.


This proposed off-leash area is guided by The People, Parks & Dogs Strategy (2017) with the goal of creating a safe and engaging park space for people with and without dogs.

The map of Vancouver to the right shows the thirty-nine dog off-leash areas in Vancouver. Nine of the sites on the map are fenced while thirty open spaces are shared.

The following slides will zoom in on the proposed site, while expanding on the principles of the People, Parks & Dogs Strategy and how they may be implemented at this site.












### Dog Off-Leash Service Areas

The People, Parks and Dogs Strategy identified the importance of providing off-leash areas (OLAs) within a 15 minute walk for most residents. An OLA at Granville Park will increase access for dog off-leash activity in three priority neighbourhoods that are currently underserved. Granville Park has suitable space and amenities that an off-leash area could be added while maintaining space for other activities.


Accessible Surfacing

The selection of surfacing should balance appearance, comfort, durability, maintenance requirements, cost, and safety. Surfacing should also consist of well draining soil, gently rolling terrain, moderate to high sun exposure, and drainage to a suitable area.

Safety is a key consideration in developing locations for dog off-leash areas. Safety features can include fencing, adequate setbacks from adjacent land uses, vegetation, and accessible circulation.


Most valued amenities as ranked by surveys in People, Parks & Dogs Strategy (2017). Participants also picked drinking water for people at 6%.

### GRANVILLE PARK DOG OFF-LEASH AREA





### Neighbourhood Context






#### **Fairview Neighbourhood**


Fairview is home to one of Vancouver's most popular attractions, Granville Island, and also to Gallery Row in the South Granville shopping district. Fairview is in the central section of the city, from Granville Island along scenic False Creek to Science World, and south to Shaughnessy.


#### Park Context

Shown for scale reference only. Location and shape of OLA to be determined through public engagement process.


#### Site Drainage

#### Site Amenities


