Jericho Lands Update

Since launching the ?əyalməxw/lyalmexw/ Jericho Lands planning program in March 2019, we have heard from thousands of people who have helped us identify key interests, ideas and opportunities that are important for the future of the site.

We last engaged the public in late 2021, when we sought your feedback on two conceptual site plan options. For much of 2022, the Jericho Lands project was paused while the landowners – a joint venture partnership between the xwmə0kwəyəm (Musqueam) Indian Band, Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) Nation, and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nation (MST Partnership) and Canada Lands Company (CLC) – focused on their Heather Lands project (see shapeyourcity.ca/heatherlands for more information).

Since fall 2022, the City project team has re-engaged with the landowners to analyze the feedback from public engagement to date, carry out further technical studies, and begin to work towards a conceptual site plan that will better reflect Indigenous design values and the importance of the site to the Nations. During this time, the landowners also conducted additional engagement with Host Nations Community Members.



This engagement has informed how MST culture will guide planning and design on the site.

Looking ahead, we intend to schedule public engagement opportunities in summer 2023 to share a preferred site concept and seek your feedback on it. In the meantime, we've added this new phase to the process (Phase 3.5). The intention of this phase is to provide you with a project and process update, as well as share outcomes of the engagement with Host Nations Community Members.

Planning Process

We currently are working towards Phase 4 of the planning process, where we will be seeking your feedback on a preferred concept plan and sharing emerging policies.

Ahead of this phase, we will be hosting a fifth Inspire Jericho Talk: Celebrating MST Culture at ?əÿalməxw/Iÿálmexw/ Jericho Lands and releasing a set of online information boards (see page 1 for details).

Following Phases 3.5 and 4, we will develop the draft Jericho Lands Policy Statement for Vancouver City Council consideration (currently targeted for fall 2023). With each upcoming phase engagement opportunities will be available.



Phase 3 Engagement

Phase 3 of the planning program took place from June to December 2021. During this phase, two conceptual site plan options were introduced. These site concepts were shaped by the Council endorsed draft Guiding Principles and Emerging Site Planning Ideas. Through extensive community engagement, we received a range of feedback that's summarized in our Phase 3 Engagement Summary.
