

?əy 'alməx^w ¹/ y 'álmexw ²/ Jericho Lands lie within the unceded traditional territories of the x^wməθk^wəỳəm (Musqueam), Skwx wú7mesh (Squamish), and sảlílwəta?4 (Tsleil-Waututh) ("MST") Nations.



¹?əy 'alməx^w is the place name in the hən 'q 'əmin 'əm ' language spoken by Musqueam and Tsleil-Waututh ancestors.

² y 'álmexw is the place name in the Skwx wú7mesh language spoken by Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh ancestors.

Introduction

?əy 'alməx^w/ly 'almexw / Jericho Lands are 36 hectares (90 acres) in size, located north of West 8th Avenue, south of West 4th Avenue, and bounded by West Point Grey Park (Trimble Park) and Queen Mary Elementary to the west, and Highbury Street to the east.

The ?əy 'alməx" / ly 'álmexw /Jericho Lands planning program launched in March 2019. It is a comprehensive planning process which will lead to the creation of a Policy Statement to guide future development of the site. The Policy Statement is being developed by the City of Vancouver, at the request of the landowners, a joint venture partnership between the x"məθk"əỷ əm (Musqueam) Indian Band, Skwx wú7mesh (Squamish) Nation, and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nation (MST) partnership and Canada Lands Company (CLC).

WHAT'S HAPPENING

?ay 'almaxw/ly 'almexw / Jericho Lands **Policy Statement**

The ?əy'alməx^w/ly'álmexw / Jericho Lands planning program culminates in a Policy Statement that will be presented to Council at the end of the process. If adopted, will guide future rezoning of the site. Establishing a preferred site plan option is a key step in the process of creating the site's Policy Statement.

What is a **Policy Statement?**

A policy statement is a guiding document that establishes principles, objectives, and policies relating to a range of topics. These include:

- Density, building types + heights
- Mobility





The ?əy 'alməx^w / y 'álmexw / Jericho Lands planning process launched in March 2019. The first phases of the process have been completed and we are moving into Phase 3 engagement which is focused on evaluation of two conceptual site plan options. The feedback gathered during this phase will lead to development of a preferred concept and draft policies.



PLANNING PROCESS

It is anticipated that the ?əy 'alməx" / y 'álmexw / Jericho Lands Policy Statement will be presented to City Council in Spring 2022. If approved, the Policy Statement will be used to guide any future rezoning of əy 'alməx" / Iy 'álmexw / Jericho Lands.

The City of Vancouver will work with the community around the?ay 'almax' / y 'almexw / Jericho Lands site, MST Partnership and CLC, and other stakeholders to create a Policy Statement for ?ay 'almaxw / y 'almexw / Jericho Lands.

Each group has the following roles:

COMMUNITY

- Identify issues, priorities and ideas to inform the engagement process, guiding principles and redevelopment options.
- Provide input throughout the process.
- Participate in public workshops and events.
- Review and provide feedback on guiding principles and redevelopment options.
- Review and provide feedback on the Jericho Lands planning program.

MST PARTNERSHIP + CLC

- Represent the x^wmə0k^wəỷ əm (Musqueam) Indian Band, Skwx wú7mesh (Squamish) Nation, and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations priorities and aspirations for the redevelopment.
- Act as proponents for the redevelopment of the site.
- Lead engagement within the x^wməθk^wəỷ əm (Musqueam) Indian Band, Skwx wú7mesh (Squamish) Nation, and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) communities to ensure Indigenous values are embedded within the redevelopment.
- Generate and refine redevelopment concepts (in consultation with City staff) balancing objectives of all parties.
- Work with the City to inform and engage nearby residents of the planning process.

WHO IS INVOLVED?



Joint Venture Partnership

The MST Partnership + CLC refers to the joint venture partnership between x^wməθk^wəỷ əm (Musqueam) Indian Band, Skwx wú7mesh (Squamish) Nation, and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nation ("MST") Partnership and Canada Lands Company ("CLC"). The MST Partnership is also referred to as MST DC (Development Corporation).

CITY OF VANCOUVER

- Coordinate the Jericho Lands planning program.
- Design and implement an engagement process with input from the community.
- Provide technical guidance on planning, urban design, engineering, transportation, housing, parks, amenities, arts and culture, and social policy issues.
- Ensure City policies and directions, landowner's objectives, as well as community priorities, are reflected in the Policy Statement.
- Facilitate discussion and coordinate feedback at open houses and meetings regarding redevelopment concepts, and draft policies.
- Draft a Policy Statement including redevelopment concepts for City Council's consideration.
- Evaluate all future rezoning applications based on the Council approved Policy Statement.
